Instructions to Accept/Decline your Financial Aid Awards

To receive payment of your financial aid awards you must accept the Terms and Conditions that are posted on the "Accept Award Offer" page in MyCCC.

Pell Grant and SEOG are federal grants that do not require "acceptance" but you must still accept the Terms and Conditions to receive these awards.

If you have been awarded Federal Work-Study and/or Federal Direct Loan, you must accept or decline those awards. You can accept the full amount or a partial amount of the award. You may want to consider this when determining the amount of Direct Loan you will need for the academic year. In most cases there are additional requirements that you must complete each year for Direct Loan. Direct loan processing will be delayed if you fail to complete any additional requirements.

Your financial aid awards are based on your enrollment status; full-time (12 or more hours per semester) or part-time (.5 to 11.5 hours) per for students with disabilities). Direct Loans require at least half-time enrollment which is 6 hours per semester. If you drop courses during t College, your financial aid awards may be revised. Also, your enrollment status is official at the end of the third week of the semester. If yo drop a course with a W grade.

After each semester, academic progress is reviewed to determine whether or not students are eligible to continue to receive their state and line.
